### **Guide to the Twentieth Century Flickr group and Facebook Page**

Flickr is an image hosting website and online community where users can share and organise their photographs. The website is free to join and upload photos (up to a maximum of 300mb per month). As well as offering the opportunity to create individual sets and collections for the user, Flickr hosts a series of groups relevant to the various interests of its users. The Twentieth Century Society has a dedicated group named 'Flickr Friends of the Twentieth Century Society'.

The Twentieth Century Society Flickr group:

The Flickr group 'Flickr Friends of the Twentieth Century Society' is designed to bring together members of the Twentieth Century Society and others interested in Twentieth Century architecture and provide a platform for sharing photographs and images related to the work of the society. The Flickr group runs parallel to the society itself, enabling members to share photographs and support the activities and wider aims and objectives of the society. The group also provides an opportunity for new users to find out more about the society.

The society aims to incorporate some members' photos into the Twentieth Century Society website and Facebook page. Photographs taken during previous C20 events are particularly useful as are buildings relevant to the current work of the society.

**Please Note:** When photographing buildings, members need to exercise discretion with views of sensitive interiors, especially private houses, but also commercial and defence premises. As a rule, these photographs should not be placed on Flickr to protect the privacy of the owners and to ensure future access for the society. Before putting any photos of private interiors on Flickr the photographer should check with the event organiser about the approach to be taken.

Guide for submitting photographs to the Flickr group 'Flickr Friends of the Twentieth Century Society':

- Join Flickr and log in to your account
- Click the 'Groups' tag at the top of the page
- On the right hand side, you will see a box under the heading 'Find a Group'. Type 'Twentieth Century Society' into this box and click search
- Click on the first group on the list called 'Flickr Friends of the Twentieth Century Society'
- Click on 'join this group' underneath the group heading
- On the next page, confirm by clicking 'join this group'
- You will now be taken back to the group's homepage. Underneath the heading, click 'add photos'
- Select which photos you wish to add to the group and click 'add to group'.

When submitting photographs please follow the guidelines:

- Tag the photograph with the building name, location and architect(s) if known.
- Tag any photographs taken during a Twentieth Century Society event with 'c20society'
- If you would like to make your photos available for use by the Society (for promotional material, the official website or just to keep on our database), please choose the appropriate copyright license or send your images direct to the Society.
